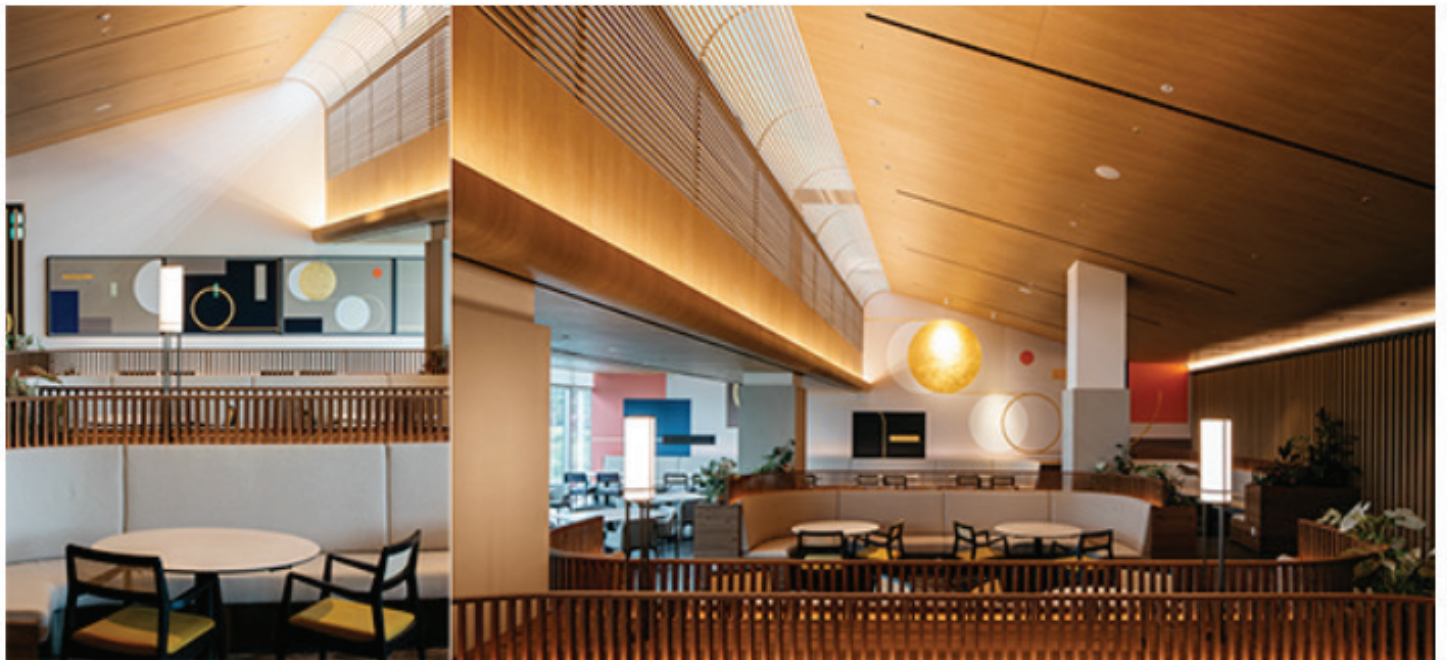

# Famous for London Olympic murals 'Sinta Tantra' ... 'Seolhaewon' Resort to show the latest work

Sinta Tantra, an artist who made a name for herself at the 2012 London Olympics by decorating the side of the Canary Wharf Bridge with a 300-meter-tall mural. He is a world-renowned artist who received the Michael Moser Award (2005), the Deutsche Bank Award (2006), and the Royal Academy Award (2012) from the Royal Academy, the best art school in the UK.

The good news is that his latest work, which will comfort the emotions weary from Corona 19, can be seen in Korea.

It is at Seolhaewon Clubhouse, a comprehensive resort resort located in Yangyang, Gangwon-do. If you go to the newly refurbished Seolhaewon Clubhouse, Shinta Tantra's new mural 'Pink Moon Rising (2021)' and six paintings with this motif will be displayed on July 23rd under the name of 'Seolhaewon Art Project'. will be presented for the first time.

Synta Tantra revealed that in this art project, Seoraksan and all elements of the universe surrounding it, such as the moon and stars, were used as futuristic pattern murals to bring life to the space. It also fits with Seol Hae-won's goal of 'complete rest'.

He said, "The space called 'wall' should not be a barrier between people and nature, but should be a space of rest and rest," he said.

An official from Seolhaewon said, "This project is not just a painting on the wall, it is a project conducted to contribute to the development of local culture in Gangwon-do and to present a special artistic experience to customers who visit Seolhaewon. The intention was to further internationalize Gangwon-do's culture, starting with the fact that it was carried out as a joint art work rather than by the artist alone."

Lee Ji-yoon (former director of the National Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art, Seoul), who oversaw this project, said, "This mural was inspired by the meaning of Mt. In particular, the image of the 'sun' using gold leaf in this mural was reborn under the name of Pink Moon and reflected in the work. Lukasz Kornacki, a craftsman of gold leaf art from Poland, who oversaw the decoration of London's Big Ben, participated in the event to further enhance the value."
